Recipe for Hedgehog Slice

Ingredients


- 250 g Scotch finger biscuits
- 1 cup sultanas (*optional)
- 125g caster sugar
- 125 g butter
- 4 tbs cocoa
- 2 tbs desiccated coconut
- 1 tsp vanilla essence

ICING

- 1 1/2 cup icing sugar
- 2 tbs cocoa
- 3 tbs water

Method Step 1

- Grease a slice tin with butter and line with baking paper.
- Crush biscuits either by hand or in a food processor, being sure to leave some larger pieces. Add sultanas, cocoa and coconut. Combine well.

Step 2

- In a small saucepan, melt butter, then stir in sugar and vanilla.
- Stir butter mixture and egg through dry ingredients until well combined.
 Press into prepared tin using the back of a spoon to smooth down the top.
- To make icing, sift icing sugar and cocoa into a bowl.
- Add water gradually, stirring, until you have a smooth, spreadable consistency. Spread icing over the slice and refrigerate before slicing into squares.
